WOOD DUCK BANDING

- 1) It doesn't always happen!! But we'll try!
- 2) Meet at 5am at Convention center and plan on carpooling to keep number of vehicles to minimum. Leave at 5:30am.
- 3) Will split into multiple groups depending on number of active capture sites.
- 4) All properties are different, some places you can see net shoot. At other sites, may wait to hear nets, then come help.
- 5) As mentioned, duck captures are not guaranteed. If one fails, we will move group to a successful capture to help band.
- 6) All on private land, not held for liabilities. Please respect private lands.
- 7) We will end this field trip at 9am to begin marsh duck banding field trips. For those continuing to marsh banding, you will begin immediately without going back to convention center. Bring your own snacks and drinks.
- 8) Lastly, again, it doesn't always happen, but we'll try! Ducks frequently outsmart us.
- 9) We will hold live auctions at 5:15am to allow folks to shoot the net (supervised). If interested, be prepared to sit in a blind regardless of temperatures.
